He also served in the legal departments of Monsanto Co., Anheuser-Busch Companies and Intel Corp.

Boggs began his career as a judicial clerk for the Indiana Court of Appeals, followed by an appointment in the Attorney General's Honor Program, where he served as a trial attorney with the U.S. Department of Justice. Boggs is also a member of the Valparaiso University board. In 2009, he was recognized as one of the 150 Most Influential People in Valparaiso's 150-year history. He was also recognized with a Burton Award as a Legend in the Law in 2017.

He earned a bachelor's degree in journalism with distinction from Valparaiso University and a Juris Doctor from the Valparaiso University School of Law. He is admitted to practice law in Indiana, Michigan and Missouri.

Boggs and his wife, Melissa, reside in Ludington, Michigan, where they are members of Cornerstone Baptist Church.
