Thrivent Action Teams empower clients with membership to put generosity into action

Where can you make a meaningful difference in your community? Identify a need, then apply to lead a fundraiser, service activity or educational event. Thrivent provides the resources, digital tools and inspiration you need to bring a Thrivent Action Team to life—including up to \$250 in seed money. If you have already completed, applied or will apply, for your action team project between October 1, 2024, and December 31, 2024, and your action team is approved, you will be automatically entered in a drawing for a chance to select a Thrivent Choice®-enrolled organization to receive a \$1,000, \$500 or \$250 donation from your Thrivent Member Network.

Open to members of the Kansas and Missouri Thrivent Member Network, the sponsor of this program. All eligible members of the TMN who submit an action team application between October 1 and December 31, 2024, at 11:59 pm Central Time, will be entered into the drawing. Three TMN members will be randomly selected to make a non-binding recommendation that the TMN make a \$1,000, \$500 or \$250 donation to an organization in the Thrivent Choice catalog; no money or anything of value will be provided to any entrant. Odds of being selected depend on number of entrants. Drawing will be held approximately January 6, 2025. If a selected entrant does not respond within five calendar days of notification by email, or otherwise fails to cooperate, a new entrant will be randomly selected.

Donate your time toward a helpful deed, useful labor or an act of kindness.

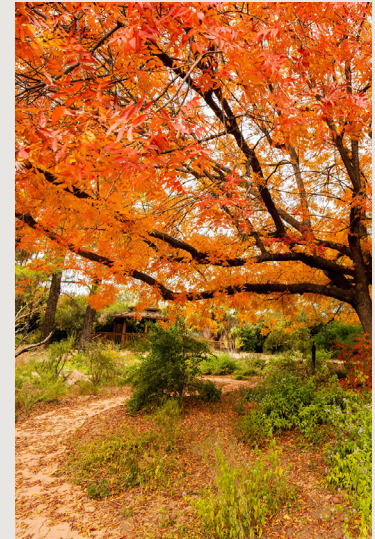
Some ideas

- **Assemble backpacks for kids** who need school supplies, or launch an after-school snack program for kids dealing with food insecurity. Use the seed money to purchase snacks, backpacks and supplies. The fall and early winter are great times to replenish school supplies that have run out at this point in the year.
- **Put together a harvest festival** or Trunk or Treat with your church. Use the seed money to help purchase food for meals, supplies for games or candy and decorations for trunks.
- **Create and send Christmas cards** to troops overseas. Use seed money to buy card supplies and postage.
- **Shop for Bible Study materials** or social event supplies for a local Christian club on a high school or college campus near you.

- **Help an elderly neighbor** with yardwork or housework. Use seed money to buy cleaning supplies.
- **Host an adoption/foster support event** and raise funds for an adoption or foster agency. Spend seed money on food or activities for the event.
- **Go shopping to purchase goods** for a local food pantry or Thanksgiving dinner basket drive. Many pantries are consistently looking for hygiene and cleaning products, as they do not receive many of those types of items and families appreciate them greatly.
- **Host a workshop** to teach people in your community something new—anything from personal finance and budgeting to mental health awareness to self defense or even how to cook healthy, budget-friendly meals. Use the seed money to hire an expert, rent out a space, or for marketing and promotional materials.
- **Add some coziness** to a hospital room by gathering a group of friends to make blankets for patients at your local children's hospital. Use the seed money to purchase blanket materials and supplies.
- **Have a trivia night** to raise awareness and money for your favorite cause. Use the seed money to promote the event, purchase food and the trivia program or buy door prizes for donors.

All for Moms Foundation
bringing peace home

All For Moms Foundation

Mission: To improve mental health outcomes for struggling moms and families by transforming cluttered homes and creating functional spaces to meet the unique needs of each family.

How have Thrivent Action Teams impacted All For Moms and the community?

Thrivent Action Teams were the catalyst that elevated All For Moms from a small community effort to a 501(c)3 impacting the entire KC Metro. You can see how the domino effect took place over the first six months of operating.

Allie Lohman, president of All For Moms: “At our second mission, we met a Thrivent client who introduced us to TAT cards. She submitted a request and was able to quickly provide us with four new cleaning kits filled with cleaning supplies. At this time, you have to imagine we were just two moms who decided to clean other moms’ houses for free. We were using our personal supplies and anything we purchased cost us our own money. I remember seeing the photo she sent us of the kits all laid out and thinking, ‘Wow—someone believes in this work.’ It was the first time that I had considered creating a non-profit, recognizing it as a legitimate business. I started to imagine what others might be willing to donate. By our third mission, we had those cleaning kits and had started to establish ourselves as a real organization—we decided to bring tables to set up the kits and create instructions for volunteers on how to use them. We had 19 volunteers at this mission, compared to our previous mission with just three of us. You can see how this small action gave us the energy to share and promote our work—and it paid off!”

Several months later, All For Moms was able to host its first volunteer appreciation event—someone donated the venue, but it left the challenge of finding catering. A Thrivent client used another TAT card to purchase charcuterie and provide a fun evening for the volunteers who have helped All For Moms get a foundation underneath them as a nonprofit. That month, they applied for their 501(c)3 and were approved!

Allie reflects, “We then bought two pink vacuums with another TAT card. At this point, we were providing cleaning supplies and equipment. I NEVER thought we’d be here—with real supplies providing a service that people really needed. Those pink vacuums represented our brand of women helping women, but also showed us how incredible it feels to provide supplies to families who have none. In fact, we have grown to love that so much we now provide new decor and furniture as well. With the supplies TATs provided us and the oomph we needed to get started, we have been able to double our missions—helping over 30 families in the last two years. We now receive referrals from many local agencies including CPS, DCFS and mental health advocates who have clients living in extreme clutter with children at risk for rehoming. We have received 175 applications for services to date. Our operations have increased greatly, and all of it can be traced back to a simple act of kindness provided by Thrivent.”

What are some ways that Thrivent clients could use their TATs to help All For Moms?

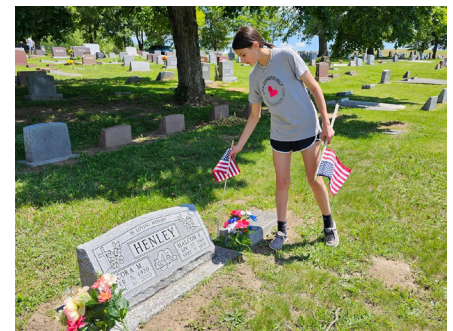
- TAT cards continue to be a pivotal tool to providing necessary goods and materials. Thrivent clients can purchase items off their [Amazon wish list](#) that includes recurring needs and supplies.
- Each mission has a cash budget of \$500, but they seek in-kind donations of furniture and decor, adding up to an average total value of \$3,000 per mission.
- They also love to provide food and beverages to their volunteers as well as appreciation gifts and awards. They are still 100% volunteer-run so this is important to keeping their team going!

- Marketing is also an ongoing need. Printing educational supplies and brochures helps to get the word out to local agencies about the work they do.

03 Giving Tuesday

Giving Tuesday is a global movement focused on philanthropy and altruism. It takes place annually on the Tuesday after Thanksgiving.

Giving Tuesday was developed to counter those days' focus on consumption. Instead of encouraging people to collectively spend money on "hot deals," the initiative promotes radical generosity—a shared commitment to doing good and helping people in need. Many organizations, including Thrivent, celebrate Giving Tuesday as a meaningful cultural moment and an opportunity to amplify the impact of philanthropy.

There are two components to Giving Tuesday at Thrivent, both of which are open to everyone:

- **Donate!** This year we are featuring [HappyBottoms](#), whose mission is to collaborate with the community to empower, connect and impact families by alleviating diaper need.

Nearly 1 in 2 families with young children do not have enough diapers to keep their child clean, dry and healthy. (The National Diaper Bank Network Diaper Check 2023.) HappyBottoms wants to change that. Since 2009 they have been covering the amount of diapers a family is short each month, known as the diaper gap, in the Kansas City Metro Area.

- **Participate.** Thrivent Member Networks are hosting a variety of virtual and in-person events in honor of Giving Tuesday.
